



## **Materials List**

### **Animal drawing - Graphite and Charcoal.**

Below is a basic kit list with suggestions of what and where to buy. Please note this is only a guide. As with most art equipment go for the best you can afford, but cheaper brands are fine for practising and experimenting. I will have some A3 sheets of cartridge paper.

### **Suppliers:**

Cass Art (online) <https://www.cassart.co.uk> - good quality, known brands, can have good deals.

The Range ( online and stores) <https://www.therange.co.uk> - has a fair amount of art equipment at good prices, tend to aim for the known brands though, larger stores are better.

Jacksons Art (online) <https://www.jacksonsart.com> - good quality for the price, good range.

W.H. Smith - larger stores do a good range of single pencils and graphite sticks.

Artesaver sell Seawhites brand, which are a good quality student range of materials at a reasonable price <https://www.artesaver.co.uk>

1. **Sketch pad A3** - I prefer a heavier weight to my sketch pads, simply because I can use it for other things as well as drawing! Such as this one below from Cass Art - 200 gsm . You can go for lighter weight if you wish( 120gsm would be lighter weight). I have recommended A3 size as I will be using that, but A4 will also work, which is smaller.

2. **Pencils - 2H, HB, B, 2B, 6B** or Derwent Graphic Pencil Tin(6 pencils) ( link below)

3. **Graphite Sticks** or **woodless pencils 4B, 6B** (Cass Art - Ko-I-Noor Graphite sticks)(Jacksons Art - Koh-i-Noor Graphite woodless pencils)- sticks are square, woodless pencils have a fine point, either are fine.

**Pastel Paper** - If you'd like to use a coloured ground to work on, pastel paper can also be used for charcoal, coloured pencil, pencil, and comes in a variety of colours that can add another dimension to your work. Pastel paper comes in pads, A4 or A3, Daler Rowney Murano or Winsor & Newton Tints Pastel Paper are in most stores (The Range, Cass Art).

Alternatively, The Range sell Winsor & Newton pastel paper in a variety of colours in single sheets for around £1.50 each, which can then be divided into A3 pieces. I would go for the more neutral colours to begin with as they are more versatile - mid grey, dark grey, ivory, cream, browns etc. There are stores nationwide.
